Easter Message

AFRAID. That was the general feeling of those who have been called disciples of Jesus. They were afraid – afraid of the unknown; afraid of failure and shame; afraid that all they have done, and witness were all for nothing; and afraid that the excitements and never seen miracles were just for a while and the show has come an ended. They had nowhere to go but home and be disbanded. And so, they thought...


