

Reflection

In Isaiah, an image of new creation is displayed with the natural world serving as a metaphor for the life-giving purpose of God's word. The heart of life is simply God's word and is revealed to us. From here, we come to recognise and understand how God's word succeeds and accomplishes our purpose in life and that his word does not return empty.

In his letter to the Romans, Paul discusses the place suffering has in our lives and despite it all, our sufferings are not worth comparing to the glory that is yet to be shown. it is through suffering we find glory but most importantly we find Christ. As children of God, by his power we are intended for glory and suffering is simply part of our journey. Paul encourages us to be patient with our suffering as we are predestined for future glorification but to simply reiterate the message to have trust in God.

The parable of sower is an allegory about the Kingdom of God where it is interpreted to reveal a hidden message. The parable is a story of growth, in particularly our own faith story. The seeds represent God's word and the different environments in which it lands on represent the way his message is received. The parable encourages us to think deeply on whether we truly are comprehending God's message and if we are truly dwelling on it, putting it to use to grow our faith. Often it is easy to be distracted by the craziness of life and we sometimes mishear or are not attentive to the word of God. Despite that, the parable encourages to be aware of how we grow our faith and whether we apply it to our daily lives.
