

26th Sunday in Ordinary Time **Christ Obedient Unto Death**

27th September 2020

Reflection

This week's readings remind us that each of us has been given the freedom to choose how we live. Every day we are faced with choices we have to make; in many instances we fail to make the right choice. It is important for us to know that we can turn to Scripture, to remind us that God is always merciful and forgiving, always ready to welcome all people who seek his mercy and forgiveness for their transgressions.

In the First Reading the prophet Ezekiel has a message for the Israelites; we learn that if we turn away from sin we will be saved, and we will live.

In the Second Reading, St Paul addressing the Philippians, speaks about how we should live as Christians, stressing the importance of imitating the humility of Christ who humbled himself, becoming a servant and finally accepting death, death on a cross. He begs us all to live out the Christian principles.

Matthew gives us another parable in today's Gospel. Parables are short stories written in the Gospels that Jesus told his followers based on real life situations; they have a religious message and are not meant to be entertaining. They invite the listener/reader into the story world and encourage a response.

Today's Gospel setting is in the temple where Jesus is being guestioned by the chief priests and elders about his authority, where it comes from. He responds with the parable of the two sons. Jesus tells the parable of a father who sends his sons to work in the vineyard. The first refuses to go and then reconsiders: he has the courage to change his mind and follows through with the request. The second son agrees then fails to do as his father requests: he is not prepared to make his contribution to family life. Jesus asks, "Which of the two did the will of his father?" Jesus tells the story and then asks the listeners to answer a question. In choosing our reply, as listeners, we pass a judgment on ourselves.

Like the second son, the chief priests and elders profess to do the will of God, but their actions do not follow through. This parable relates to the lack of connection between what they say and what they do. They had rejected the prophet John who came to them with the message. On the other hand, the tax collectors, and prostitutes, ("sinners" in the eyes of the authorities), accepted John's message afterwards like the first son, and are making their way into God's kingdom ahead of these authorities.

Today's parable invites us to bring our actions in line with what we profess, no matter the cost. That is what it means to take up the challenge of working in the vineyard. MARK'S PAKURANG


